- ✝ **Food Bank** - Many thanks for all the generous donations during both appeals for emergency support for the food bank based at St Martins. On both occasions the team have been deeply appreciative of the many bags and boxes of food we've been able to gather. It has been an answer to their prayers both times when they didn't have enough. The food has been shared with families who are also very grateful for the gifts they have received.  
Many people have expressed a desire to continue practical support. A great way for us to support the food bank is to help with creating 'Friday boxes, boxes that are prepacked with supplies for a single person, couple or family who need emergency supplies over a weekend before they can access other agencies on a week day. There will be a permanent collection box in the front of St Marks for tinned meat, fish, veg, soup, beans/pulses, pasta/rice, cereal and UHT milk, tea (packs of 40) and coffee, we will also try to add toilet rolls, tooth paste, tooth brushes and soap. This month we have enough soap/toilet roll/tooth paste etc but are starting from scratch with food donations.  
Boxes will be packed up on the last weekend of each month and given to the team at St Martins for distribution. If you are able to contribute please drop off donations in the box or at our home. Thanks, Claire Finney
